Youth AI Literacy Pathways (YALPath) is a student-founded initiative building accessible, honest AI education for young people — starting with the question too many curricula skip: whose experience is this technology actually built for? We design workshops, discussion circles, and curriculum that help students understand how AI models are trained, whose data shapes them, and where bias can quietly take root.
